Enrise is an Australian registered charity delivering technology based supported programs to vulnerable and at-risk children and youth.

What we do

Through our award-winning delivery partner social enterprise platform **Need a Tutor**, we provide online tutoring and donated digital devices to K-12 children most in need of support.

- Vulnerable children are provided with a donated repurposed computer if they do not have one.
- Enrise will find, match and connect a qualified teacher / tutor with each child and conduct regular tutoring sessions via Need a Tutor's proprietary platform.

What outcomes do we achieve

Digital provision and tutoring support through Enrise yield significant improvements, particularly for those experiencing prolonged educational gaps due to transition, poor school attendance or low literacy and numeracy levels. We see:

- 1. An increase in student confidence, improvements in school attendance and advancements in academic levels.
- 2. A trusted ongoing relationship with a qualified teacher / tutor
- 3. Increased school graduation resulting in improved employability and / or tertiary admission.
